# WELCOME NOTE

## MR. VIJAY GOEL

MP (Rajya Sabha)

It is my privilege to introduce **Mr. Vijay Goel**, our **Chief Guest** today. Mr Goel is a multifaceted and dynamic reformer, a vociferous grass root social worker, and a crusader of causes close to his heart, and a dedicated thinker and worker on various issues concerning the governance of Delhi. Members' Bill; Goel left no stone unturned and succeeded, when the Govt. of India passed a bill in 1999 banning Single Digit lotteries across India. Vijay Goel established - Toy Bank - a not for profit organisation in 1987 that collects toys from donors, refurbishes/restores them and then redistributes the toys amongst the underprivileged children in Delhi.

Mr Goel is known for his original and innovative ideas on the issues concerning Delhi. He has given the mantra for making Delhi the best city in the world: "Accountable Governance, Participatory Governance and Sensitive Governance." What we want is vigor in the blood, strength in the nerves, iron muscles and nerves of steel, not softening namby-pamby ideas." The College is in the process of adding new courses viz. BA (H) Mathematics, B.Sc.(H) Statistics and B.Sc (H) Computer Science.

## 2.4 New Purchases:

Over the years, the institution has continuously endeavoured to improve the infrastructure and facilities. As a result of these efforts the College now boasts of five fully functional computer labs, fully computerized and air-conditioned library and classrooms fitted with audio-visuals aids capable of providing multi-media enabled learning environment. The College expresses its gratitude to the University of Delhi for facilitating the installation of the above infrastructure.

During the academic year 2014-15 the College made the following significant acquisitions:

- I. 16 Additional CCTV cameras were installed at strategic locations in the College premises.
- II. Four Daisy Players/Recorders were purchased for the blind students to ease their process of acquiring knowledge.
- III. An Order has been placed for the installation of a solar power plant in the College as a part of green initiative. Work is in progress in this regard.
- IV. An Order has been placed for the installation of a Rain Water Harvesting plant in the College as a part of green initiative. Work is in progress in this regard.
- V. For Journalism students, a camera mike, MP3 Recorder and a heavy tripod was acquired to strengthen their Multimedia facilities.
- VI. We are in the process of acquiring/installing big LED screens on each floor and in the staff room to serve as a bulletin board to convey necessary information to students and staff. These will also be used to display important events of the College through PPTs.

## 2.5 Maintenance:

The proper maintenance of building and equipment is important to ensure smooth functioning of the College. Our College maintains the best possible standards in cleanliness and sanitation. The round the clock security guards keep a strict vigil on entrants in the building and check the possibility of any untoward happening in this temple of learning. The maintenance Committee of our College has worked tirelessly to ensure the upkeep of the College. The committee worked closely with the administrative staff to identify shortcomings and took appropriate actions. The Chairman and the Treasurer of the Governing body have played a pivotal role in ensuring that College infrastructure has been repaired and maintained in cost efficient and timely manner. During the year, power cables and electrical panels were upgraded keeping in view increased power needs in the future. A professional housekeeping agency was engaged to maintain clean and hygienic premises. Adequate security arrangements were put in place by



installing electronic surveillance equipment and hiring professional security personnel. The College garden has been maintained under the able guidance of Dr. Mahesh Kumar. Rain Water pipes were repaired; air conditioners and other equipment were also repaired as and when required. Disposal of scrap/written off equipment was done as per standard established procedures.

## 2.6 Students' Enrolment

Over 2000 students are enrolled in the College. Beside the regular BA and B.Com programmes the institution offers undergraduate honours courses in Commerce, English, Hindi, Punjabi, Political Science, History and offers two professional courses namely Business Economics, and Hindi Journalism & Mass Communication. At the postgraduate level, the College offers M.Com and MA (Punjabi). In the academic year 2014-15, under review 705 students enrolled in undergraduate courses, while 13 new students joined M.Com. and MA(Punjabi).

## 2.7 Bhai Gurdas Library

For the growth and development of an educational institution, library is an indispensable institution which serves both the teachers and students alike. Books in Brail Script, note pad etc. are made available to visually impaired students and teaching faculty as and when required. Further especially maintained kit has been provided to the students under ADIP Scheme.

OPAC facility has been provided to the users of the library. Effective steps are undertaken for the maintenance purpose in the library at particular intervals.

Library Committee (Convenor: Dr Vinayneet Kaur) duly constituted by the Staff Council of the College manages the financial and academic activities of the library.

We are considering to setup e-zones in the library for the use of Internet facility for the users of the library.

The present budgetary allocation for the library is approximately Rs. 9,00,000/-

## 2.8 Computer Labs

The College has five computer labs which are enabled with internet Access Facility (IAF) and Wi-Fi facility. These labs are equipped with 170 computers, two Servers and 15 printers which are available for the use of students and faculty members of the College for their academic requirements. These facilities are well-maintained and constantly updated in order to cater to the needs of the user in an efficient manner. The College also has a UGC resource centre which is currently equipped with one computer and one printer.

## 2.9. Medical Facility

*Dr D. L. Chopra* is available for medical consultation from 9:30 am to 2:30 PM on all working days. A small dispensing unit for homeopathic medicines is also available in the staff room which is being looked after by Dr Mahesh Madan.

### **4.1 Placement Committee**

This year the placement season concluded with many big companies visiting the College with a handsome salary package. The Placement Cell of the College aims to provide students with working experience where they can utilize their knowledge and learn more in various divisions of an organization. Therefore, we strive to bring in opportunities for the students which they can explore and step them into real world.

To accomplish the goal of placing maximum students and brightening their future, support and guidance from the teachers plays a key role. The Convenor of Placement cell, Dr. Vinod Kumar's support was integral towards achieving this aim. Assistance of Dr. Parvinder Kaur Anand was fundamental in nurturing the Cell.

### **4.2 Right to Information (RTI)**

In the year 2014-15, the College has received ten requests for information under the RTI Act and all have been disposed of within the prescribed time-limit.

It is the team's effort to create a friendly environment that has shown results as no case of ragging was reported in the academic year under review.

#### **4.5 Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC)**

EOC is established in order to address the concern and issues related to SC/ST, OBC, Minorities and the physically challenged. EOC facilitates smooth conduct of administrative procedures, administrative interaction and movement of differently abled in College premises. - To help the visually impaired students read books and prepare assignments, a list of student volunteers along with their contact numbers is maintained and updated from time to time. Angel recording devices have been provided to the visually impaired students to enable them to record the lectures.
- Enabling unit in the College if functional:
  - a) A screen reading "JAWS" software has been installed on 2 computers to help the students to use computer and internet facilities.
  - b) College has also purchased Portable reading camera
  - c) Students with disability are given 100% fee waiver as per new guidelines issued by the university circular no. Aca I/082/2001/Pwd/2012-2013/355 dated 1st September 2012.

#### **4.6 Examination Committee:**

The Examinations Committee successfully and efficiently conducted the university semester examinations. Over 2000 students appeared in the examinations held for different streams and disciplines. Under the supervision of the Examination Committee various tasks relating to examinations like entertaining the university examinations form, preparation and issuance of admit card, etc were successfully accomplished. The underlying factor for the smooth conduct of examinations is due to the dedication and meticulousness of the teachers of the College who efficiently discharged all invigilation and other duties relating to the examinations.

#### **4.7 Websters**

"Websters", the website development committee and the website management committee have been formed this year with the view (a) to develop the guidelines and policies for College's web presence and (b) to examine strategies

This year the Committee has attempted a review of the current status of College website with the view to re-design it. ## **5. Our Achievements:**

### **5.1 Innovation Project**

An innovation project titled UNDERSTANDING THE ATTITUDE OF COLLEGE - STUDENTS TOWARDS RELIGION AND POLITICS (SGND202) was undertaken by a group of three teachers of our College viz. Dr Davinder Kaur Chawla, Dr Vinayneet Kaur and Dr Deepak Sharma and ten students - Sheena Sharma (BBE 3rd year), Shitiz Gupta (BBE - 3rd Year), Priyanshi Wadhwa (B.Com III yr) Harjeet Kaur (BA ENG (H) III yr), Shubham Walia (B.Com (H) III Year), Abhay Bhutani (B.Com (H) III year), Kunal Basantani (B Com (H) III year), Ayushi Aggarwal (B.Com (H) III year), Akriti Khokhar (BA (H) Pol Science III year) and Akanksha Sinha (BA (H) Pol Science III year). Professor V. Upadhayay, Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi has been associated with the project as the Mentor. The participatory research project has been completed and the final report submitted to the University. The Innovation Group showcased the project in the *Antardhwani* festival of Delhi University where the Vice Chancellor appreciated the efforts of the group and commented "great work" in the Visitors book. The research findings of the project have been very well received in the academic circles.

The innovation project team organised a one day seminar on Religion and politics on 18<sup>th</sup> March 2015 to discuss the findings of the research. A significant outcome of this project is the in house internship opportunity provided to the students to enable them to 'learn and earn' a stipend while they study. This year ten students have benefitted from this experience.

### **5.2 ANNUAL SPORTS AND NCC DAY**

**7. Academics College:**

***National Seminar/Conference/Workshop Organized by the College***

**7.1 National seminar on Guru Granth Sahib**

A National Seminar was held on “Guru Granth Sahib in 21<sup>st</sup> Century: Traditions and Modernity” on **27<sup>th</sup> February, 2015** which witnessed a confluence of the learned scholars from varied disciplines. Delivering the keynote address Dr. Manmohan Kaur stressed on the intrinsic relationship between a healthy mind and body for a healthy life. She explained that spiritual enlightenment is required to conquer the evils of Kam, Krodh, Lobh and Moh. Dr. Inderjeet Singh talked about the interface between Sikh traditions and modernity and opined that the idea of secularism as enshrined in Guru Granth Sahib’s is a precursor to the socialist thought. S. Harinderpal Singh elaborated the



practical teachings of Guru Granth Sahib and the need for adopting the ideas of this all inclusive growth of equality. Dr. Akal Amrit Kaur, an established scholar from Punjab dwelt upon the role of Guru Granth Sahib in the development of personality. She felt that various meanings and messages of Guru Granth Sahib need to be 'decoded' and interpreted. 5. As a prelude to our annual inter College fest Surlok, a talent identification drive called Mini surlok was organized in the College by A & C society with a view to provide a platform to the students to compete and shortlist the best talent through several rounds of competition. Contests were held in the field of card making, poetry recitation, ad-mad, treasure hunt, creative writing, fun games etc.
6. Surlok, the annual inter College fest of the College was a gala event. The College was decorated magnificently and wore a festive look, thanks to the untiring efforts of Imapsto, the artists' team who worked tirelessly for several days in order to create a right ambience for fun and celebration. Cyber- clan led by our computer wizard Naman Sehgal, contributed brilliantly towards the superb designing of posters, brochures and stage setup.
