1.

Critically comment on the function of Yudhisthira's *Rajasuya yagnya* (Royal Consecration) as discussed in the Game of Dice section of the *Mahabharata*.

b. "...because you are lost in the thought of one to the exclusion of all else, you shall be lost in his thoughts..."

Critically analyse the structural and thematic importance of the device of the curse in Kalidasa's play *Abhijnanasakuntalam*.

Critically comment on the roles of Anasuya and Priyamvada in Abhijnanasakuntalam.

c. "Where will you find the boldness for such a fearful deed? And in the fearful act, as you bring death upon your children, how wil! you prepare hand and heart? How will you look upon your children and in the act of slaying them refrain from weeping? When your children fall down and beg for mercy, you will not be able to dip your hand in blood with a heart that does not falter"

Critically examine the tension between motherhood and violence in the given passage. 10

Critically comment on Jason's perception of Medea as a 'barbarian' in the play Medea.

2. Do you think that Draupadi successfully destabilizes the authority of 'the books' on wifehood, or do her questions and the responses they evoke reinscribe scriptural power? Discuss with reference to the Game of Dice episode of the *Mahabharata*.
