**Lodhi Colony, New Delhi**  
**6 November 2017**

**Brief Report**

Photobug members organized a photowalk to Lodhi colony in Delhi on 6<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. Lodhi colony is dubbed as the street art gallery of Delhi, with lots of art walls all around the place.

The area comprises of triple storey and double storey buildings and blocks of shops with pop colours and abstract shapes drawn on the walls facing the road. The art is funky but it also calls out important issues like climate change, marginalised communities, freedom of expression etc. The murals were created for the third edition of the Lodhi Art Festival, curated by the five-member St+Art India Foundation and supported by Asian Paints. The aim is to help make a wider audience engage with art by taking it to the streets, thus creating an "open-air art museum".

Members of the team gathered in Lodhi Colony at 9:00 am. They roamed around the area and took landscape and portrait photographs. They shared creative ideas to capture some very interesting photographs. It was a great learning experience for all the members who participated in the walk.
