The neighborhood is extreamly popular among foreign and domestic tourists. Majnu-ta-killa houses a monastery and Buddhist temple, preaching Tibetan Buddhism. Thus the place looks like a canvas painted with the vivid colours that never fail to catch the eye and provides an ideal location for street photography.
