PHOTOWALK Mehrauli Archaelogical Park 29 September 2018 Brief Report

A photowalk was organized to Mehrauli Archaelogical Park situated in south Delhi on 29th September 2018. This was the first photowalk for the session 2018-19, conducted soon after the recruitment process. It provided a wonderful opportunity for newly recruited members of the society to interact and gel with the senior members as well as to showcase and improve their photographic skills. The theme of the photowalk was 'Heritage and landscape'.

Spread in an area of 100 acres, the Mehrauli Archaeological Park comprises of many scattered monuments — a legacy of centuries of architectural skill. It is located close to the World Heritage site, Qutab Minar, and is of prime historical value in the local, national, and international context. This area is dotted with remains from every era of Delhi's history — from the pre-Islamic to the late Mughal and the colonial period. Some of the area has also been redeveloped into garden and nursery. Thus it provided the perfect spot for capturing photographs based on the theme, Heritage and landscape.

Members gathered at the park at 8:30 am in the morning. They took a survey of the place and then started with clicking pictures of various monuments. Senior members mentored the new members and shared their experience and knowledge with them. Mobile photographers were also able to capture good photographs as they tried to understand the manual settings in their device.

A total of eighteen photobug members participated in this activity. The photowalk concluded at 11:30 pm.
