Activities (if any) Our one-day educational trip to Tughlaqabad Fort was an enriching and memorable learning experience. The trip was organised by VIRSA – The History Society , with the aim of providing practical exposure to medieval Indian history. We departed from college in the morning and, upon reaching the site, explored the magnificent fort built by Ghiyas-ud-din Tughlaq in the 14th century. The visit began with a detailed exploration of the massive stone walls, strong bastions, grand gateways, and the ruins of palaces. We carefully observed the sloping defensive walls and discussed the distinctive architectural style of the Tughlaq period, which emphasized strength and durability. We also visited the tomb of Ghiyas-ud-din Tughlaq located just in front of the fort, connected by a causeway. The red sandstone structure with its white marble dome and fortress-like design reflected the uniqueness of Tughlaq architecture.	



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The trip was made even more meaningful due to the **guidance of Tanya Ma'am, Deepti Ma'am, and Deepak Sir**. Overall, the educational trip successfully combined learning with exploration and strengthened our understanding of history beyond the classroom.

Main Ideas

- 1. Enhancing Historical Knowledge** – To deepen students' understanding of the Delhi Sultanate period by studying the political background and administrative vision of Ghiyas-ud-din Tughlaq through on-site exploration of Tughlaqabad Fort.
- 2. Appreciating Indo-Islamic Architectural Style** – To examine the architectural elements of the Tughlaq period, including the use of red sandstone, simplicity in design, fortress-like tomb structures, and the makbara of Ghiyas-ud-din Tughlaq located opposite the fort.
- 3. Connecting Classroom Learning with Real Heritage** – To bridge theoretical knowledge of medieval Indian history with practical observation through field study, encouraging critical thinking and historical inquiry.
- 4. Encouraging Experiential and Collaborative Learning** – To promote teamwork, discussion, note-taking, and active participation under the guidance of teachers, making history engaging beyond textbooks.
