College Infrastructure

Bhai Gurdas Library

The Bhai Gurdas Library serves as a key academic resource of the College and houses an extensive collection of books, journals and magazines that support teaching and learning. In keeping with the need for modernization the library has transitioned from manual log books to a digital footfall recording system using Koha Software which has improved data organization and student activity tracking. The adoption of this system has also enabled efficient management of cataloging circulation and OPAC services and has enhanced overall library operations. Faculty members and students now benefit from online access to resources which ensures greater convenience and accessibility while membership of INFLIBNET and DELNET further strengthens the library's academic resource network and outreach.

Computer Labs

The College is equipped with seven fully functional computer laboratories that provide reliable internet connectivity and support academic activities. Students and faculty members are offered free access to Wi Fi services which enhances digital learning and research. The infrastructure comprises 180 computers along with two servers and six printers for academic use. Regular maintenance and timely upgrades are carried out under the capable supervision of Mr. Sunny Kumar to ensure smooth and efficient functioning.

Student Counselor

Ms. Shenna Dhingra Sabharwal is a qualified and experienced counselor who is available in the college on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 11 am to 1 pm. Her primary role is to support the mental and emotional and academic wellbeing of students through a structured and empathetic approach. She provides one on one counseling to students across all courses and semesters. She addresses a wide range of concerns that include academic stress and examination pressure as well as personal challenges such as anxiety, depression and relationship issues and also concerns related to body image and self-esteem. Each session is designed to create a safe and non-judgmental environment that encourages reflection and resilience while regular group sessions also help students explore career options by setting goals and manage study related stress effectively.

College Canteen

A canteen acts as the quintessential place where a student's physical and mental health can be groomed. Given the dishes offered, it maintains students' energy levels throughout the day. Besides that, the canteen also acts as a socializing ground for promoting friendship, teamwork, and communication among the students.

Our college canteen, named FOOD POINT, offers a range of food items from Indian, Chinese, and Continental to packed snacks. It is operational between 8 am to 5 pm from Monday to Saturday. The meals are generally low-priced. Popular items include samosas, bread pakoras, momos, chaat, and chai, etc.

The college canteen is supervised by college canteen committee. It ensures that the food is freshly prepared and nutritious and also ensure that staffs and students have access to hygienic and affordable meals and snacks in a pleasant dining environment.

College Gym

The College offers an in-house gym facility accessible to both students and faculty through a membership system. Recognizing the strong connection between regular physical activity, overall fitness and enhanced academic performance, the gym aims to promote holistic well-being by encouraging awareness of both physical and mental health. It is equipped with modern fitness machines and tools to support diverse workout routines and personal fitness goals. The facility operates from 10 am to 4 pm under specific terms and conditions, providing a convenient and supportive environment for the college community to engage in regular exercise and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been a pillar of strength, commitment and innovative practices over the years. It has retained its objective of developing the functioning of college in a transparent manner. It has ensured application of ethical parameters in amplifying the academic and administrative performance.

For the period 2025-26, IQAC has dedicated itself in accomplishing promotions of faculty members. Nine teachers have been promoted to Senior Assistant Professor (Level 11). Principled and just frameworks were used for evaluating performance of faculty members.

Besides this, IQAC has continued with its practice of Mentoring the Mentor Program, where mentors (teachers) are guided and skilled in various dimensions such as motivating students, dealing with exam stress, absenteeism and many more. The purpose of such practices is to equip mentors with all techniques which they require in helping and empowering students.

Continuing with its legacy, sessions for students are organised from time to time where teachers and the mentors transfer their learned skills to students. Students of all subjects are randomly divided into different class groups and teachers other than their subject teachers are allotted for the session. The objective is to give students a safe

environment where they can, free from any hesitation, speak up and build interactions and network beyond their classrooms.

IQAC organised a Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM) on 26th February 2026 in offline mode. Parents were invited to college and informed about the progress of their children. The purpose was not only to keep parents aware of their children's performance but to also build connectivity with parents and make them assure that they have their children in safe hands and we are working to ensure their required academic growth and personality development.

Furthermore, two seminars, four workshops, six lectures/talk, one international conference, and one industrial conclave have been conducted over the period under the aegis of IQAC, ensuring the goal of equipping students and teachers with the knowledge of critical analysis, creative ideas, intellectual growth, and overall academic development is achieved.

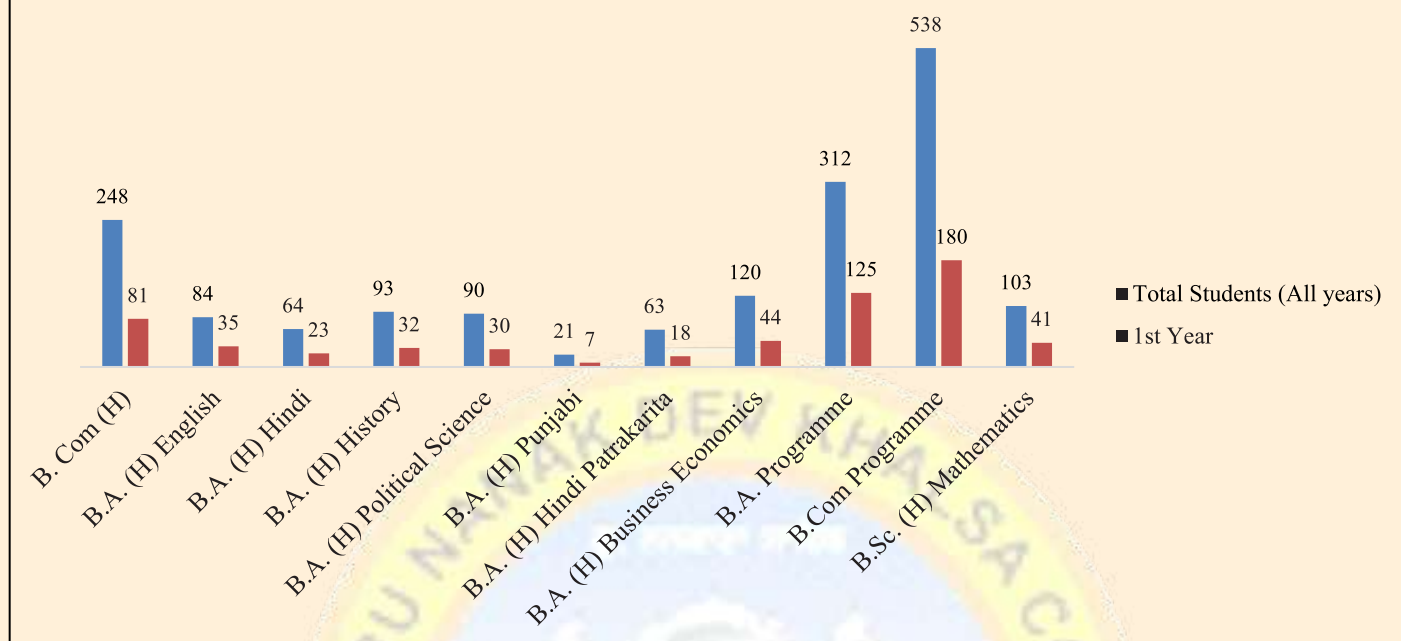

One-Day Interdisciplinary International Seminar on Politics, Economy and Media Culture: Amid Global Transitions

Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, University of Delhi organized a One-Day Interdisciplinary International Seminar on the theme “Politics, Economy and Media Culture: Amid Global Transitions”. The seminar was jointly organised by the Civil, Kirt and Kalam Societies of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, University of Delhi. Seminar Convenors Dr. Kamla, Dr. Mamta Ahuja and Dr. Simran Kaur Sethi presented the introductory note, highlighting the contemporary relevance of the theme. Chairman S. Sukhbir Singh Kalra and Officiating Principal Dr. Baljeet Singh warmly welcomed the distinguished guests and appreciated the collaborative academic initiative. The Chief Guest, UGC Full Commission Member Prof. Sushma Yadav, stressed that the ultimate aim of classrooms and seminars is the expansion of knowledge, irrespective of language. She reflected upon changing global dynamics and highlighted the interconnected role of politics, economy, and media in shaping higher education and social justice. The seminar witnessed participation from scholars representing premier institutions such as Panjab University, Jawaharlal Nehru University, Kurukshetra University, Jamia Millia Islamia, Indira Gandhi National Open University, and IIFT. Nearly 40 research papers were presented across four parallel sessions in Punjabi, Hindi, and English. Themes included globalization, artificial intelligence, media ethics, diaspora literature, energy politics, economic inequality, multiculturalism, and women’s representation in cinema.

In the Valedictory Session, Prof. Amanpreet Gill described politics, economy, and media as a triangular framework of modern society and emphasized the growing complexity of media - politics relations. The seminar emerged as a significant academic platform fostering meaningful dialogue on global transitions.
