Main Ideas:

Day 1:

Session 1

Prof R.S. Sarraju emphasized on the sustained growth of science and technology for nation's progress which should come from indigenous ideas. He instilled a positive hope of Indian research becoming internationally comparable under the New Education Policy.

Session 2

Prof A.K. Mishra spoke about NEP putting more value on research in higher education institutions. He emphasized the important role of administrators, starting from the Ministry of HRD to the University VCs and College Principals in creating and improving a proper research ecosystem and the role of teachers in being self-motivated for conducting good quality research.

Day 2:

Session 1

Dr. Anchal Arora shared her experience and knowledge on choosing a topic from one's own interest areas when preparing a research proposal.

Session 2

Prof S. Sandhya discussed the various approaches to writing a literature review. She emphasized on the relevance of rigorous knowledge synthesis i.e. literature review in any academic discipline.

Day 3:

Session 1

Dr. Devesh Birwal focussed on the various approaches of research, chronology of the research methods in the whole process of research, sampling techniques, hypothesis creation and some tools of hypothesis testing.

Session 2

Prof. Naveen Kumar explained in detail how a reference manager helps in organizing research, generating bibliographies, collaborating with others online, and discovering the latest research. He gave an example of the reference manager software Mendeley and explained its working in detail.

Day 5:

Session 1

Prof. Shailendra Kumar explained the various types of publications and their relevance, including an overview about gray literature. He also spoke about methodology and importance of documentation.

Session 2

Dr Kiran Choudhary gave a brief history on research ethics and discussed the ethical principles of research, like integrity, competence, honesty, confidentiality, privacy, autonomy etc.

Day 6:

Session 1

Ms. Ayushi Mona explained the current scenario where India has become hub for startups but early-stage support for startups are concentrated in tier 1 cities. She discussed the gap between the education ecosystem and innovation ecosystem.

Session 2

Dr. Vikram Bansal explained in detail how the varied categories of Intellectual Property such as Patents, Designs, Trade Marks, and Copyrights.

Day 7:

Session 1

Prof. Rekha Sethi emphasized the importance of 'Hindi Diwas' which is celebrated every year. She talked about various provisions in the NEP by which our dependence and colonial mindset will be nullified.

Session 2

Prof. Dr. Shashi Bala highlighted India's legacy of the number system and decimal system to the world and the superiority of India's metallurgical achievements.

Day 8:

Session 1

Prof. Bharat Gupt explained about Indian Aesthetics and its components and talked about the relationship between aesthetics and philosophy and how both are linked with each other.

Session 2

Prof. Rajnish Kumar Mishra discussed the meaning and aspects of 'sacred' in the Indian context. He highlighted the four-fold goals of life- dharma, artha, karma and liberation and also discussed the growth of Indology.

Day 9:

Session 1

Prof. Anuradha Ghosh talked about various methods and linkages with epistemological research. She emphasized that inquisitiveness in researchers is one of the natural gifts which helps him to reach the desired goal. She also talked about how the journey of language reached the present stage and interlinked it with different paradigms of research.

Session 2

Dr. Ajay Verma discussed the various philosophical frameworks for research and stated that the quickest of our actions involves and presupposes some ontological conception of the object towards which the action is directed.

Day 10:

Session 1

Chamu Krishna Shastri emphasized on the vastness of Indian civilization and discussed that the Indian history was known as the Vedic age, as it was depicted in the earliest Indian writings, called the Vedas.

Session 2

Prof. Shashwati Goswami discussed that Community-based Research is a methodological practice with a focus on the community. She further discussed the challenges of Community-based research and the need for years of connection for the community to accept the researching institute/groups.

Day 12:

Session 1

Prof. R.M. Channaveer explained the term 'community' and emphasized the presence of mutual trust, common interest or cause shared amongst different groups in a community.

Session 2

Prof. A. Shahin Sultana highlighted the relevance of inclusivity in research informed teaching. She also discussed about child abuse and how right guidance at right age with right support can save lives of many.

Day 13:

Session 1

Prof Battu Satyanarayana started with the discussion on how developing skills amongst students play a pivotal role in reducing unemployment in our country and talked about the importance of fostering research aptitude among high school students and cultivating research culture at an early stage.

Session 2

Prof Dinesh Kumar began the discussion about research and innovation and the difference between these two. He further discussed multidisciplinary research. He shared data about the Global Innovation Index and top research countries. He stressed on the potential impediments in research and the reason why university is now in research priority.

Day 14:

Session 1

Prof Shivaraj stressed upon the specific objective of increasing the current status of SSR in India in terms of important aspects of collaborative research programmes undertaken by the major SSR institutions.




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
