

REPORT ON NATIONAL WEBINAR

Constitutional Obligations- Values, Rights, Duties and Responsibilities of Citizens

29th May, 2020

The National webinar on Constitutional Obligations- Values, Rights, Duties and Responsibilities of Citizens was jointly organised by IQAC Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, University of Delhi, Anand Institute of Social Work (AISW) and the Bhopal School of Social Sciences (BSSS) on 29th May, 2020. It was attended by more than 150 participants across the country which included the faculty and the students. Dr Sheeba Joseph, the IQAC coordinator of Bhopal School of Social Science introduced Advocate Enosh George Carlo as the resource person of the day. He is the Special Public Prosecutor Government Advocate at the High Court of Madhya Pradesh.

With the backdrop of the current situation in India during Covid 19 that relates to issues like migration, minority representation, the resource person emphasised on the values as the essence of the constitution which targets on justice. Justice as per him is a multidimensional in approach as it covers social, political and economic perspectives. Through these constitutional values the flaws of the Indian society can be amended and justice can be established. He later discussed the core values of the Constitutional rights and duties and linked it to the responsibilities of the citizens by declaring that through modern education, scientific temperament, free media, citizens irrespective of their ideologies should stand with the country and its constitution in the midst of the crisis.

The talk was followed by a question and answer round where the enthusiastic participants asked questions ranging from biased media, strained rights and dignity of citizens, unawareness of the citizens about their rights and law.

Dr Deepak Sharma, IQAC coordinator of the Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, University of Delhi gave the vote of thanks to the resource person for an engaging webinar on a very relevant topic.
