Photobug – The photography society of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa college organised a online webinar in collaboration with **Pinhole** – The photography society of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa college on July 20, 2020. The photography webinar was titled Webinography. Mr. Virendra Adhikari, a professional photographer was the resource person for the event. He has an experience of working with Canon and is now a freelancer and consultant in the field of professional photography.

The webinar was focused on three topics:

- Basic framing and composition
- Commercial Photography
- Long exposure

Explaining the first topic, Basic Framing and Composition, Mr Virendra talked about the rules of composition like Rule of Thirds, Shapes, Symmetry, Cropping and Object placing. Following these guidelines is very helpful to capture more compelling photographs, lending them a natural balance, drawing attention to the important parts of the scene, or leading the viewer's eye through the image.

The second topic discussed, Commercial photography, was subdivided into three parts – Expectation, Experience and Achievement. He said that these three aspects are interrelated and the importance of each brings out enhancement of others. Mr Virendra shared many fields where commercial photography skills can be utilised, for eg. E-commerce, brands, blogger photoshoots, product photography etc. He also taught us the way to approach different platforms.

The last topic to be discussed was Long Exposure, which is also known as slow shutter photography which includes using a long-duration shutter speed to capture the stationary elements of images while blurring, smearing or concealing the moving elements. Examples of star trails, light veils etc were shown and explained very well.

The webinar was open to public and approximately 25 students from both colleges were in attendance. Following the presentation by Mr Virendra, the attendees asked few questions, shared opinions and thoughts in the Q and A session. All the participants felt that the webinar was very informative and productive.
