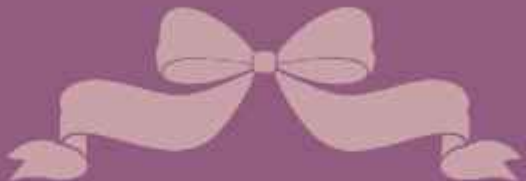

IN HONOR OF NGŨGĨ WA THIONG'O:

A life in words, a legacy in liberation

(1938–May 2025)



"Belief in yourself is more important than endless worries of what others think of you. Value yourself and others will value you. Validation is best that comes from within."

— Ngũgĩ Wa Thiong'o, *Dreams in a Time of War*

In the world of literature and revolutionary storytellers, we remember and pay tribute to **Ngũgĩ Wa Thiong'o**, Kenyan writer, playwright, and scholar as his voice powerfully resonated through the stories of colonial struggles, artistically penning down a nation's voice.



Tipped to win the **Nobel Prize for Literature** countless times, Ngũgĩ's life and work stood as a testament to the power of language, memory, and cultural reclamation, along with paying tribute to his mother tongue “Gikuyu” marking a revolution against the oppressing colonial identities and empowering his roots.

“The condition of women in a nation is the real measure of its progress.”

— Ngũgĩ Wa Thiong'o, *Wizard of the Crow*

In one of his most renowned works, **Decolonizing the Mind**, Ngũgĩ laid bare the psychological toll of colonialism and challenged the dominance of Eurocentric narratives in African education and literature, inspiring writers and nationalists from all over the world to reclaim their voices from colonial frameworks. A chapter of imprisonment and exile lies in his life narrative but that did not stop him, as Ngũgĩ wrote his **first Kikuyu novel, Devil on the Cross**, while in prison.

Let's honor Ngũgĩ Wa Thiong'o not only as a literary icon but as a revolutionary thinker whose words continue to inspire movements for justice, identity, and decolonization. His legacy endures in every young writer who dares to write in their native tongue, in every reader who questions inherited histories, and in every voice that chooses liberation over silence.
