Webinar on Women's Security: Law and Social Responsibility

Date: - 9 March 2021 No. of participants: 70

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, University of Delhi organized a webinar on "Women's Security - Law and Social Responsibility". It was held on 9th March, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. via Google Meet. Advocate Pragya Bhushan, who is a Corporate Lawyer and POSH trainer in cases of sexual harassment against women, was the guest speaker. She is also Managing Director of Law Firm Vikalp and Promoter Director of NGO, Vikalp-EkSamadhan. She guided the students regarding the rights of the women in the constitution and law. The webinar began with a welcome note by our event coordinator, Dr. Jasvinder Kaur Bindra, followed by an enlightening webinar by the guest speaker. Advocate Pragya Bhushan talked about various problems, which women face during their everyday lives. She first discussed how the women safety in India has always been a challenge for law-andorder authorities in the country. She also discussed situations of rape, sexual molestation, child marriage, mental harassment and other problems that women face. She stressed upon the fact that when cyber - bullying happens, it is important to document and report the behaviour so that it can be addressed. It is necessary to understand these issues amongst future change makers of our nation as teenager girls are most affected by these problems because of their development stage. She explained the role of government and judiciary that they should come together for quick delivery of justice for women in India. By the end of the session, we learnt the problems that women face, their possible solutions, the authorities which women can approach and so on. The webinar ended with an interactive question and answer part in which Advocate Pragya Bhushan took pains to address every question posed by the students. The popularity of the session can be gauged by the fact that it went on for two hours. Online Traffic Training Campaign Date – 19 March 2021 No. of participants: 60

NSS Unit of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College has organized an Online Traffic Training Campaign on 19th of March 2021 at 05:00 PM. Mr. Sunil Sen, Ms. Santosh Chauhan and Manpreet Singh were the guests of the event. The team also gave information about the "Motor Vehicle Act and Traffic Rules" and also said that the best way to keep others and yourself safe is to follow proper traffic rules. Whenever you drive a car, follow the traffic rules, it is important to wear helmet while driving a two-wheeler, obey the traffic lights to avoid accidents. One should always wear seat belt while driving a car. Avoid rash driving as speed is the core reason of accidents. Always carry all the paperwork of the vehicle. Mr. Sunil Sen and Mr. Manpreet Singh motivated the staff. They spoke of how Road traffic today is inherently dangerous. In fact, in contrast to other modes of transport such as railways and air traffic, the road traffic system was not designed with safety in mind. Consequently, in road traffic it is us humans who make the difference between hazard and safety, with little keeping us from harm, should we make a mistake. Given that humans are almost inadvertently prone to make mistakes

and commit violations, human behaviour is of particular interest for most road safety professionals. That is where road safety campaigns come in. Together with other 'behavioural' measures (e.g. law enforcement, education, training, and even infrastructure to some extent) road safety campaigns are used as a means of influencing the public to behave more safely in traffic. Road safety campaigns can be defined as purposeful attempts to inform, persuade, and motivate a population (or sub-group of a population) to change its attitudes and/or behaviors to improve road safety, using organized communications involving specific media channels within a given time period. It can have many and multiple purposes, such as informing the public of new or little-known traffic rules, increasing problem awareness or convincing people to refrain from hazardous behaviors and adopting safe ones instead. The college teaching staff along with NSS volunteers and other students of different colleges have attended the webinar as well. A strength of 60+ students were present in the session. The Traffic Training session lasted for 1.5 hours from 05:00 PM to 06:30 PM. The session concluded with an interactive session between the instructor and the teachers in which the queries of the teachers were addressed satisfactorily. It can affect your upper respiratory tract (sinuses, nose, and throat) or lower respiratory tract (windpipe and lungs). It spreads the same way other coronaviruses do, mainly through person-to-person contact. Infections range from mild to deadly. SARS-CoV-2 is one of seven types of Coronavirus, including the ones that cause severe diseases like Middle East respiratory syndrome (MERS) and sudden acute respiratory syndrome (SARS). The other coronaviruses cause most of the colds that affect us during the year but aren't a serious threat for otherwise healthy people. 1954, for the care and protection of orphan, helpless, abandoned and neglected children. It is situated in Connaught Place. The NSS team reached the orphanage at around 11 am and stayed till 5 pm.

We distributed clothes, stationery, toys, games, bags, etc. which were collected in our last event "Clothing with Dignity - a collection drive". We also distributed foodstuffs like biscuits and chocolates. We indulged in various activities with them such as dancing, singing, reciting poem, sports, discussing about their hobbies, helping them to prepare for their exam, etc. in order to get along with them and it proved to be wholesome.

This visit in itself was enough to experience that 'giving' comes with immense joy and soul-stirring satisfaction.

Visit to Kirti Nagar Slum Date -13 March 2018 No. of Participants - 10

"The slums are not a place of despair. Its inhabitants are all working towards a better life." Having said that, it is really important to see slums with aspirations and envision rather than with repugnance. To take this view further NSS Unit of Sri Guru Nanak DevKhalsa College, University of Delhi, visited a slum in Kirti Nagar on 13th March 2018, Tuesday. The team reached the slum area at 10 am and stayed there till 4 pm. The main focus of the visit was to understand the conditions and situations in which they live, the problems they face each day, their mindset and their ambitions. Our team went over there with a lot of questions in mind about whether they feel safe and secure, whether they send their children to school or not, whether they get medical facilities, whether they are able to feed their family with their income or not and so on and so forth but surprisingly we got positive answers.

We started with our survey regarding their living conditions and got to interact with many people, then we spent some time with kids by teaching them basic things like healthy habits, good manners, etc. as well as we helped them with their curriculum. We interacted with them and they shared their stories. The kids are so talented that they win awards in co-curricular activities as well as they excel academically. By interacting with those people, we learnt that they feel satisfied with what they have and they have adapted themselves to these conditions. Women are mostly engaged in household work but to get an extra income they do stitching and embroidery work. They send their kids to school regularly which means that they don't live with a backward mindset. The primary school is situated within the slum to attract more and more children. Their only concern is that they don't have a permanent house to stay in and each day they live in this fear that they will have to desert their house someday.

During the visit, NSS volunteers not only shared the experiences of the slum dwellers but also attempted to suggest hand on solutions to the problems of education, cleanliness, commutation etc. NSS also plans to sensitize other students of the college by bringing these stories and pictures to them through various platforms.

Blood Donation Camp Date - 20 March 2018 No. of Participants - 76

A Single pint can save Three Lives, a Single gesture can create a Million Smiles.

Blood donation is a most important social service to the humankind. Keeping this in mind, NSS Unit of Sri Guru Nanak DevKhalsa College, University of Delhi organized "Blood Donation Camp" in the college premises on 20th March 2018, Tuesday. The camp began at 9 a.m. and continued till 4 p.m. It was organized in collaboration with Lions Blood Bank, a project by Lions Club, which is based in Chennai and operates blood bank and camps in many cities. We were able to collect 76 Units of blood.

A registration desk was placed in the ground area to register the students, teachers, and non-teaching staff who volunteered for blood donation. They were assisted by the NSS Volunteers in filling the form and for further formalities. A bloodmobile of Lions Blood Bank; a mobile donation center (vehicle) equipped with everything necessary for a blood donation procedure was stationed in college premises wherein all the tests and blood donation took place. NSS Fair with Sikkim and North East Theme Date - 22 March2018 No. of Participants - 80

Volunteers of National Service Scheme along with Student's Union of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College organized its annual fair TASHI'18: #redpanda on 22nd March 2018 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the college premises. The theme of the fair was "Tourism in Sikkim" that was in accordance with the directive of Ministry of Human Resource Development.
