Placement Cell has been active all through the current session towards providing top-notch jobs and internships to aspirants. Its members worked over time with a view to inviting different companies for various drives in the college as well as conducting seminars on diverse topics.

Being a Society that looks after the growth and development of its student members, it began the current academic session by organizing workshops

on topics such as Cold Calling and E-mail Writing.

The cell was also able to rope in 45+ companies, such as, Mirus, Leverage Edu, Qrius, DU Insights, People's Kapital, Triedge, Qrius, EduShedu, Eat My News, Glocar, Aspire etc. for a range of internships in HR, Marketing and Business Development. Some of the NGOs, like Win over Cancer,

Aiesec and Aspire, were also part of the exercise.

To create opportunities for the students to enter into the corporate world, it invited companies such as Royal Bank of Scotland, Genpact, Inshorts, IIM Jobs, Finedge, HBS, Career Marshal, FIS, Secure Now, L&T Construction, NIIT, Social Cops, Decathlon, RBS, Tommy Hilfiger etc. and many more. Some of these offered packages as high as 4-4.5 lacs per annum, to begin with. Under the aegis of the cell, educational articles are published on our Facebook page, twice a week, which are very informative and inspirational for the students aiming to make it big in the corporate world. Also, several seminars were conducted in the college campus under the auspices of the Placement Cell. These included GD-PI seminar in collaboration with IBS and Resumè Building seminar in collaboration with Talerang and more.

Social responsibility is another key aspect that the cell has been working on progressively. Concomitantly, a seminar on the topic Rebuilding Hope was organized in collaboration with the NSS. It had guest speakers from NGOs like Goonj and Teach For India.

ENGLISH DEPARTMENT: TALK ON WILLIAM SHAKESPEARE

As a follow-up on Prof. Gil Harris lecture on Macbeth in the Even Semester last year, the department kicked off its extra-curricular activities in the present

semester on 18th January

2018, with a talk on the 'Bard of Avon' by Mr. Sridhar Balan, an eminent scholar, teacher and senior consultant with Ratnasagar Publishing House. Mr. Balan spoke on the topic Transmission of Shakespeare's Texts. As he began his talk with a quote on Shakespeare by Ben Johnson, "He was not of an age, but for all time, " the ever mesmerizing magical image of the Bard came floating into the eyes of the audience turning them immediately spellbound. Mr. Balan traced the history of publication of Shakespearean dramas. He revealed some lesser known facts about him, like, that Shakespeare never published plays during his life time and that when he died, 18 of his plays died with him; that Shakespeare's plays were meant to be performed and though a few of them had indeed been printed during his life, these were bad Quorto editions, including Pavier Quorto. Mr. Balan shared a very interesting event of Shakespeare \$\#39;s life and its link with publication history of his plays. He told that when Shakespeare died, he left a sum of 36 shillings for three of his friends to buy rings as mementos to remember him. But Hemings and Condell wanted to do more than just buying rings to preserve his memories. They resolved to publish his plays in a single folio format. This eventually became the famous First Folio. He said that it took the printer, William Jaggard, and his son, Isaac, almost two years to complete printing 750 copies. Finally in 1623 the First Folio was published and he described it as the most important secular work in the English Language. The First Folio saved Shakespearen plays from textual corruption and oblivion. The speaker also expressed his concern about the decline in the reading habits of the present day generation exhorting it to read more and more books. Mr. Balan's presentation not only brought alive Shakespeare & #39;s charm but also made the audience recall famous lines from the play 'Antony and Cleopatra', 'Age cannot wither her, nor custom

stale her infinite variety', as a befitting tribute to 'myriad minded' Shakespeare. The talk ended on a note filled with Mr Balan's wit and sense of humour. It was an enjoyable experience for the listeners



SHORT STORY WRITING COMPETITION

On the initiative of Dr. Kumkum Yadav, the Department of English organized a short story writing contest for the college students on 24th January, 2018. A total of 14 entries were received, out of which three stories were selected for the first, the second and the third prizes. The students were asked to write on one of the three subjects that were given to them. The subjects were-Gender issues in the contemporary times, Environment and its impact on our present and future, and the Role of technology in the human world today.

An encouraging revelation was that the contestants who took part in the competition came from not just literature but from other, diverse disciplines like Political Science Hons., B.Com. Hons and BA Prog. All the contestants wrote well, and though not everyone could lay their hands on the prizes, it was an encouraging experience to discover so much creative talent in our students.

Question Nation, where six teams from different colleges participated to show their knowledge of literary events and personages; Microtale Writing, where impromptu topics were distributed among the participants to pour their hearts out to create poignant tales; Ad Mad Competition, to provide students a space to demonstrate their creativity in writing promotional strategies in marketing; Slam Poetry, to stir dormant poetic talent of participants by offering wings to their imagination; and last but not the least, Pictionary, which saw maximum participation from students of not only our college but other colleges as well and included great fun and frolic for all the students.

VIRSA

Local History Tour

The History Society of the College, VIRSA, organized a Local History Tour of some historical monuments of Delhi, belonging to the Medieval Indian period, on January 20, 2018. Students of BA (Hons.) History and BA (Prog.) of all the three years, accompanied by faculty members of History Department, visited the following sites:

Humayun's Tomb- Being a part of the syllabus, covering Medieval Indian history and Indo- Islamic architecture, the hands on study of the various monuments in the Complex proved very beneficial for the students.

Damdama Sahib Gurudwara- Situated near Humayun's Tomb Complex, this historical Gurudwara Sahib was built to commemorate the important meeting between the 10 th Sikh Guru; Guru Gobind Singh and Prince Muazzam, and later Mughal Emperor Bahadur Shah in 1707. Our students and teachers not only visited this historical site but also partook of the langar served at the Gurudwara Sahib.

Qutb Complex- The last part of the visit was to Qutb Complex comprising architectural monuments from the Sultanate Period of the 13 th and 14 th centuries. Dr. Preeti Singh made students familiar with the new elements and features in Indian architecture introduced by the Turks. Mrs. ShobhikaMukul, Dr. Preeti Singh, Ms. Radhika Mishra, and Dr. Deepak Nair accompanied the students for this local history tour. VIRSA also organised a History Quiz on February 13, 2018 for the students of BA (Hons.) History and BA (Prog.). The programme started with a warm welcome accorded to the Vice-Principal, Dr. Gurmohinder Singh by the faculty members and the President of students' body in the department. Dr. Raghbir Singh, Convenor, Department Of History, gave a short speech to highlight the activities of Virsa. Mrs.Shobika Mukul, Dr.Preeti Singh, Ms.Radhika Mishra and Dr.Deepak Nair were also present at the occasion. Dr. Preeti Singh, who conducted the Quiz, did a wonderful job as the Quiz-master. The Quiz was well attended by the students. The participants were very enthusiastic and had prepared well for the activity. There were six teams of two members each, drawn from all three years of the two courses. There were 8 rounds in all, which comprised questions on Indian and World History. An Audio round and a Visual round were also conducted. The guiz was very informative and interesting for the participants as well as the audience.
