PAST EVENT RECORD

-March 10, 2022:

Movie Screening & Abstract Writing Competition: A short film addressing sexual harassment was screened, followed by a thorough discussion and an abstract writing competition among attendees. The top 3 pieces were displayed on our Instagram page and the winners were featured on our stories as well.

-March 10, 2022 - March 25, 2022:

Self-Defence Workshop: Organized with the assistance of Delhi Police, the workshop aimed to teach girls basic self-defence techniques, enhancing their sense of safety in unfamiliar environments.

-September 8, 2022:

Street Interview: Members of Girl Up Preet interviewed the public at Connaught Place, gathering views and opinions on feminism and disseminating awareness through handouts.

-January 21, 2023:

Donation Drive with Ihita Foundation: A collaboration between Ihita Foundation and Girl Up Preet resulted in a donation drive for sanitary pads in slums near Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, New Delhi. The initiative also included educating slum residents about the Prandhanmantri Janaushadi Kendra.

-February 13, 2023:

National Women's Day: Girl Up Preet expressed appreciation by distributing handmade cards to female staff at Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College.

-February 16-17, 2023:

<u>Collaboration with Aranya:</u> Girl Up Preet collaborated with Aranya, The Environment Society of Zakir Hussain Delhi College, to showcase and financially support handmade crafts created by underprivileged women at Zakir Hussain College fest "PANKHUDI."

-International Women's Month (March 2023):

- <u>(March 1, 2023)</u>: Advocate Akshita Singh, who litigates at the Delhi High Court, held an enlightening session on empowering women and promoting gender equality at Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College.
- <u>(March 8, 2023)</u>: Girl Up Preet hosted an Instagram live session with Dr. Jasneet Kaur Datta, a child psychologist, discussing mental health issues and practical ways to overcome body dysmorphia and eating disorders.
