Event - Webinar on Role Of Teachers In Ensuring Mental Health Of Students during The Lockdown

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College organised a webinar on the topic Role of Teachers in Ensuring Mental Health of Students during the Lockdown on 2nd May, 2020. The webinar was conducted by Dr. Renu Kishore, a well-known psychologist who recently retired as Associate Professor from the Department of Psychology, Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi. It was a great success with a huge participation from colleges across the country. The webinar began with a welcome note by Dr. Neeta Dhingra, following which Dr. Renu Kishore began her presentation on the role of teachers in the psychological well-being of students. Dr. Renu highlighted that in the present unprecedented scenario, with complete disruption of routines, every individual is impacted in a different way. The lockdown has led to psycho-social upheavals, stress, frustration and mental health concerns.

Major concerns of students during the lockdown are uncertainty about the future, mood swings, lack of motivation to study, lack of privacy at home, peer relationship issues, lack of exercise and excessive screen usage. Students away from home face multiple challenges. Dr. Kishore advised teachers to avoid preaching, moralizing or criticizing and listen to students with empathy and a non-judgemental attitude. Teachers should guide students to follow a daily schedule which include adequate time for studies, housework, exercise, entertainment and bonding with family. Students should prepare short term and long-term targets. She later discussed a few real-life examples which were relatable for many. The program concluded with an interactive session where the audience raised their queries. The programme ended with vote of thanks by Dr. Neeta Dhingra.

An event was organized by the Cyberclan society: The IT Society of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College on **Cyber Crime** on 13 February at 4:00 p.m. The event began with the positive note of Ms. Herman Kaur. And the host Anil Naudiyal welcomed Advocate Mr. Prashant Manchanda.

About the speaker

Sh. Prashant Manchanda is a practicing Advocate- Supreme Court & High Courts And Counsel for Legislative Assembly of NCT of Delhi (Appointed by Speaker, GNCTD). He was appointed by Hon'ble Chief Justice Delhi High Court as a member of Anti Defacement Committee. And was involved in framing guidelines and laws to curb the Defacement of public properties.

About the webinar

The event began with the insights of Mr. Prashant Manchanda about his professional journey in cyber-crime. He addressed the attendees about what's right and what's wrong in cybercrime and shared his father's advice regarding the crime "One should first find the remedy of the crime in law." He told the students about what cybercrime is and how to deal with it. And he further discussed the law that is the National Security Act made in 2008 and its implementation in 2009. He shared his experience of the cases related to cyber-crimes and also aware that what should be things one should do in case of being a cyber- crime victim.

In his session, he also stressed about 5 dimensions of war including the importance cyber war and stated how young minds could help to curb cyber-crimes if they would be unanimous. He also shared an anecdote of APJ Abdul Kalam that once it was asked to Mr. APJ Abdul Kalam that where he sees India in the next few years. He politely answered that a country would grow when the youth of the country would study.

Ultimately the session concluded with Mr. Prashant Manchanda, answering the queries of students on important skills required to curb cyber-crimes.

The Webinar began with an introductory note by Dr. Priyanka Chanana followed by the presentation of Dr. Smita Sahgal. Dr. Sahgal began by giving a brief introduction about the topic. She first spoke about the situation of women in early 20th century. Then, she discussed the problems that women faced at that time. As we all know that when British came, they tried to uplift the Indian women by giving her some rights. She elucidated on some famous reformers or leaders who played important role and how they formed various samaj for upliftment of women and then subsequently girls could express themselves. She elaborated on the themes of abolition of *sati pratha*, child marriage, education and property rights. She discussed about some magazine stories like Gharalaxmi and also about different instructions for girl's education. She discussed on the idea of women education that was becoming popular in those times as this way an educated woman would be a goodwife and mother also. She further elaborated on how women became the part of society from the edge of society. The lecture concluded with the question-answer round by Dr. Jasvinder Kaur Bindra who presented the audience questions to the speaker for the smooth flow of events. 

In the tenth edition of its associations with the IQACs of Anand School of Social Work, Anand, and Bhopal School of Social Sciences, Bhopal, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College organised a webinar on the topic “Psycho – Physical Challenges of Girls in HEI’s” on Google meet (<https://meet.google.com/ryf-fghrkjw>). Dr. Krishna Shah, Asst. Prof in Department of Gynec and Obs at Smt. Malini Kishore Sanghvi Homeopathic Medical College was the Resource person of the session. She has been practising Classical homeopathy and applied clinical hypnotherapy in various age groups since many years. The webinar focused on the upbringing of girls especially during the puberty and adolescence age. Dr. Shah beautifully spoke about the various taboos and myths that the older generations still believe in and explained the difference between adolescence and puberty. Dr. Shah asserted that physical changes not only affect the body and appearance but also affect the child psychologically. She expressed her worry about the insecurities that young people develop for their appearance which leads to fear of rejection. The second area of her discussion was about menstruation, in which she covered the challenges that young girls face. She handled such a sensitive topic with great enthusiasm and talked freely about it without any hesitation. When her discussion ended, a question answer round was held where all the queries of the participants were taken.

The Programme concluded with the vote of thanks which was given by Dr. Sheeba Joseph IQAC Coordinator, Bhopal school of social sciences. The webinar was a huge success and enlightened a lot of people to take these psycho - physical changes in girls in a positive way.

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, University of Delhi organised a webinar on "Women Security: Law and Social Responsibility". It was held on 9 March, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. via Google Meet. Advocate Pragya Bhushan, who is a Corporate Lawyer and POSH trainer in cases of sexual harassment against working women. She is also Managing Director of Law Firm Vikalp and Promoter Director of NGO, Vikalp – Ek Samadhan. She guided the students regarding the rights of the women in the constitution and law. The webinar began with a welcome note by our event coordinator, Dr. Jasvinder Kaur Bindra, followed by an enlightening webinar by the guest speaker. Advocate Pragya Bhushan talked about various problems, which women face during their everyday lives. She first discussed about how the women safety in India has always been a challenge for law-and-order authorities in the country. She also discussed about rape, sexual molestation, child marriage, mental harassment and so on problems that women face. She influenced upon the fact that when cyber - bullying happens, it is important to document and report the behaviour so that it can be addressed. It is necessary to understand these issues amongst future change makers of our nation as teenager girls are most affected by these problems because of their development stage. She explained the role of government and judiciary that they should come together for quick delivery of justice for women in India. If we conclude, by the end of the session, we would have learnt the problems that women face, their solutions can be done, the authorities to which women can approach and so on. The webinar ended with an interactive question and answer part in which Advocate Pragya Bhushan took pain to address every question posed by the students. The popularity of the session can be gauged by the fact that it went on for two hours. The programme was brought to a close with a vote of thanks by our college principal, Dr. Gurmohinder Singh and our NSS programme officer, Dr. Deepmala.

The Internal Complaint Committee, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College organised a webinar on 16 June 2020, Tuesday. The topic was Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, Redressal), Act 2013. Our guest speaker was Ms. Prita Jha, a noted solicitor, women's and children rights activist.

First and foremost, she equipped all the participants with some basic concepts which we often overlook while discussing sexual harassment. It was emphasised that for an incident to qualify as sexual harassment, there has to be a sexual element attached to it which can range from unwelcomed touching and asking for sexual favours to making inappropriate gestures and sexually coloured remarks. Ms. Jha also informed about legal remedies available to the victims of other forms of harassment or abuse that do not come under the purview of this Act. The participants were made aware of how mandatory consent is and how imparting training on everyone in a workplace can play a crucial role in eliminating the patriarchal environment. Anyone, directly or indirectly, intentionally or unintentionally, may be a part of a culture which breeds workplace patriarchy and sexual harassment, as the speaker duly mentioned.

Getting into the technicalities of the act, she informed that anyone can seek redressal despite their age, position or employment status. There is no need for complainants to prove their employment status at the firm, and it can also include clients, customers or any outsider who has been sexually harassed at the workplace. The complaint can be filed against anyone working for the organisation, in a written form. The Internal Complaint Committee is required to assist those who cannot write.

The webinar was well received and concluded with the speaker taking up some queries raised by the participants. Despite the wide range of queries, she meticulously advised the students on various topics such as false complaints, legal provisions for blackmailing and online/virtual offences.

The talk was informative and enlightening not just in terms of the technical know-hows provided, but also by virtue of its eye-opening nature. It definitely unlocked several doors for self-introspection on how we as a society, irrespective of gender and age, can be far more accommodative and kinder to everyone. With workplace becoming increasingly diverse and gender neutral, the need to uproot the deeply entrenched systematic discrimination and patriarchy has never been higher.



The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College had the happy privilege to organise a webinar on the topic “Now Men Need to Challenge Patriarchy”, open to students and teachers, on 13th May 2020. The renowned feminist, Kamla Bhasin was invited as the speaker. Ms. Bhasin needs no introduction, as she is known for her work on gender sensitization, human development and education. She carries the weight of her description on the internet as an “Indian developmental feminist activist” with remarkable ease and nonchalance. She has written many songs, poems and stories on the themes she feels strongly about.

Dr. Gita Lakhanpal, senior faculty and member of the IQAC of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College welcomed the speaker. Ms. Bhasin chose to speak in Hindustani, and that set the warm and informal nature of the entire session. Ms. Bhasin introduced the participants to the ideas of patriarchy, sex, gender and indoctrination.

She elaborated on the differences between natural and man-made concepts. This led to her definition of patriarchy as a social system that assumes that the male is superior. Patriarchy, she explained, gives men more control over three things—resources, decision-making and ideology. Due to the complicated way in which such ideas are propagated in society, ironically, it becomes women themselves, who become responsible for practicing patriarchy in their homes. Ms. Bhasin gave the audience a simple solution—if patriarchy is created by humans, and we don’t find it appealing any more, we should simply change it.

She elaborated on the difference between sex and gender. She encouraged us to recognize the superior nature of a woman’s body—it is stronger, more resilient and able to produce offspring. Gender, a man-made construct, is what labels the woman as the weaker sex. The main thrust of her talk was to encourage men to come out against patriarchy. She spoke of how men too, are labelled within patriarchy, as people who cannot/should not cry, not feel pain or express their feelings openly. She then urged the men to speak up against the restrictive nature of patriarchy. She guided the participants towards a society where gender differences do not hinder the growth of the individual. The speaker’s talk led to a lively discussion and it was wonderful to see how her thoughts had ignited the minds of the students, who came forth with insightful questions. The programme concluded with the vote of thanks, which was delivered by Dr. Deepak Sharma, who is the Coordinator, IQAC, Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College.

Bisman, the Centre for Human Values, conducted a 30-hour certificate course in February – March 2021 to educate the students on “Mindfulness and Human Values”. The various topics covered in this Value-Added Course included:

- 1) Guru Nanak’s Tenets and their relevance today.
- 2) Communications Skills
- 3) Professional ethics
- 4) Concept of Sewa and its importance.
- 5) Visit to Gurudwara Bangla Sahib.
- 6) Problem solving.
- 7) Indian thinkers

- 10) Mind management.
- 11) Quiz and Vocabulary.

Dr. Bhagwant Kaur’s talk on Guru Nanak’s Tenets and their Relevance Today, was the first session on Guru Nanak’s Dev Ji’s teachings. A Short-Term Online Certificate Course on Holistic Fitness and Wellness Learning was jointly organised by the IQAC and the Department of Physical Education of Mata Sundri College for Women (University of Delhi) and Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College (University of Delhi). Prof. (Dr.) Harpreet Kaur, Principal, Mata Sundri College for Women and Prof. (Dr.) Gurmohinder Singh, Principal, Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College were the patrons of this course. Ms. Charanjeet Kaur-(TIC, Dept. Phy.Edu. & Sport Science), Dr. Lokesh Kumar Gupta- Coordinator (IQAC) and Dr. Gursharan Kaur- Assistant Professor (Dept. Phy.Edu. & Sport Science) were the members of organising team of Mata Sundri College for Women. Dr. I.P. Singh (Convenor) Sports Committee, Dr. Rajwant Singh (co-convenor) TIC Phy. Edu. & Sports Sciences and Dr. Neeta Dhingra (Coordinator) IQAC were the members of the organising committee of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College.





With the backdrop of the current situation in India during Covid 19 that relates to issues like migration, minority representation, the resource person emphasised on the values as the essence of the constitution which targets on justice. Justice as per him is a multidimensional in approach as it covers social, political and economic perspectives. Through these constitutional values the flaws of the Indian society can be amended and justice can be established. He later discussed the core values of the Constitutional rights and duties and linked it to the responsibilities of the citizens by declaring that through modern education, scientific temperament, free media, citizens irrespective of their ideologies should stand with the country and its constitution in the midst of the crisis.

The talk was followed by a question and answer round where the enthusiastic participants asked questions ranging from biased media, strained rights and dignity of citizens, unawareness of the citizens about their rights and law. Dr Deepak Sharma, IQAC coordinator of the Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, University of Delhi gave the vote of thanks to the resource person for an engaging webinar on a very relevant topic. Dr. Ninad Jhala, Principal, Anand Institute of Social Work formally ended the programme with a vote of thanks.

Akshita Tiwari, General Secretary of Envisage society delivered the vote of thanks to conclude the event.





Wildlife Week is celebrated every year from 2nd October to 8th October with the view to make the public aware about wildlife preserve the fauna of India. The Indian Government has established an Indian Board of Wild Life which works to improve the awareness as well as the consciousness of the Indian people towards the preservation of wildlife. EnviSAGE the environmental society of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College conducted a webinar to highlight such human myths that often come complimentary about the reptilian group of Indian vertebrates.

The agenda for the webinar was “More than Scales, Spines, and poison: A glimpse into the secret world of the Indian Reptile,” conducted on 4th October 2020 at 3.00 pm. The guest speaker for the webinar was Dr. Varad Giri, who is an expert in the field of herpetology, a term used for the study of amphibians and reptiles, to enlighten us Indian reptiles. Dr. Varad Giri completed his Ph.D. from North Orissa University. He was formerly Curator at the herpetology section in Bombay Natural History Society and has also worked as a Postdoctoral fellow at the National Centre for Biological Science, Bengaluru. The motive behind conducting the webinar was to create awareness regarding Indian reptiles and the myths that follow them complementarily.

The webinar started with a welcome note by the host, that followed a brief introduction of the guest speaker and a roadmap of how EnviSAGE is planning to go about the wildlife week celebration. After this, the podium was handed over to Mr. Varad Giri, who chose to wear a snake T-shirt, pictorially creating a sense of comfort for reptiles among the participants. He began with the webinar delivering a thankyou note to Mr. Ashish Thomas (Convenor EnviSAGE) for having him for the event. Starting with the agenda of the talk Mr. Varad explained the basis of a rudimentary myth that all snake release venom, he distinguished broadly between the venomous and non-venomous species found in the country. He further explained the root cause of the problem, perception of the local community, medical treatment for the snack bite that one can adopt as a first-aid to mitigate the problem. The speaker then highlighted around 300+ snake species that have been spotted around northeast India, and in the western ghats. Further, he shared amazing detailed information regarding the size variation, poisonous speciation, especially sharing the traits of the four most magnificent snake species i.e. cobra, common krait, Saw scaled viper, & Russell's Viper. The speaker mentioned the insights about the venomous species through pictures by explaining their traits. Moving over to the next category of reptilians the speaker highlighted the character, types & traits of lizards. The next to the house was a question around where everyone could put their queries in the chatbox, to which Mr. Varad Giri answered with great enthusiasm. The speaker concluded then webinar by urging the audience to change their attitude towards these speechless creatures.

In the end, feedback form was circulated among the participants The engagement in the chatbox showed their enthusiasm regarding the webinar. Following the feedback, vote of thanks was delivered by Mr. Ashish Thomas to Mr. Varad Giri, all the lecturers & participants of the college for their presence.

The Internal Quality Assurance Committees of Anand Institute of Social Work, Anand, Bhopal School of Social Sciences, Bhopal, and Sri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College, New Delhi, jointly organised a webinar on the “**New Perspectives on Nature Conservation in Post-COVID 19 Era**” on 5th June 2020, to commemorate World Environment Day 2020. The resource persons for the seminar were Professor Radheshyam Sharma from the Department of Environmental Studies, University of Delhi. A passionate environmentalist, he has a huge experience in his field, and Dr. Suneetha TB, Acharya Institute of Technology, Bengaluru.

Dr. Ashish Thomas, the convenor of the Environmental Studies Department of SGND Khalsa College, welcomed the speakers to the programme. He introduced the theme for the day and explained how our current relationship with Nature were threatening our life on Earth.

Professor Radheyshyam Sharma spoke on “Ecological Entrepreneurship to Redesign the Earth and lead the Global Market in the Post-Covid World”. He said that this was an important time to discuss and review our relationship with nature. He said that while life expectancy had risen considerably, the bad news is that the whole generation is at risk due to environmental degradation and pollution. This is an anomaly. In India, we can afford better things, but the quality of life has not improved. Water, air, soil—all these elements are contaminated. The quality of our environment has deteriorated. Economic indicators are strong, but social, health and environmental indicators are weak. It was with this backdrop that Professor Sharma explained that our growth is not sustainable, and our link with environment and nature is broken.

Dr. Deepak Sharma introduced the next resource person. Dr. Suneetha TB, an Associate Professor of Biotechnology at the Acharya Institute of Technology. She leads the NAAC and NBA of her college, and has more than twenty years of academic experience. Her talk was titled “Impact of Pandemic on Environment and Social Development” Dr. Suneetha spoke about the origin of the pandemic and discussed the nature of the virus and the environment it thrives in. She explained the difference between endemic, epidemic and pandemic diseases. She described the nature and origin of the Corona virus and then presented the chronology of the spread of the disease, from a localised infection, to the pandemic proportions it has achieved presently.

Ms. Sukhvinder Kaur took forward the session by conducting an interactive session with the participants, who had many questions for the speakers. The programme concluded with the vote of thanks, which was delivered by Dr. Ninad Jhala, the principal of Anand Institute of Social Work, Anand.


