Her contributions to the college and its community were truly remarkable and she left a lasting impact on both her colleagues and students. Her extensive experience and profound knowledge in her field made her an invaluable asset to the institution.

She has made significant contributions to both literature and teaching, enriching the academic community with her insights and passion for knowledge. During her academic journey of 40 years she presented/published around 100 papers in National, International Seminars, Conferences & Workshops/ Research Journal/Books/Magazines. Her areas of interest are fiction, feminism & Sikh Dharam Shaastar.

She published four books namely Narivad: Viহারak Samikhya (2021), Sikh Dharam Shaastar Da Tatt Saar: Postmodern Perspective (2010), Ajit Kaur da Galap Bodh (2009) and Nari Chintan Paripekh te Vihar (2001).

She also edited two books: Nari Kav Samvedna- a text book which is prescribed for Undergraduate students of Delhi University, Delhi and Katha Jagat - a textbook which is prescribed for class XII students of Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE).

She was deputed to Institute of LifeLong Learning (ILLL), Delhi University for one year. Her Post- Doctoral Research Work was on Feminist Criticism and she also worked on Sri Guru Granth Sahib under UGC Research Award Scheme. She was also the co-editor of Punjabi-Hindi Kosh, Kendri Hindi Nideshalya.

In the Gurmat Short Term Course organised by Punjabi University, Patiala at Mata Sundri College she presented papers on Ajoke Manukh Nu Gurbani Da Sandesh, Dharam Ki Hai, Gurbani Vich Nari Chetna, Gurbani Vich Jot Ate Jugat Da Concept and Sikh Dharam Vich Nari. This academic research in spiritual issues was driven by several factors, including the desire to understand the psychological and social benefits of spirituality and its impact on individuals and communities. It aims to explore the relationship between spirituality and other aspects such as education and well-being.

She was also awarded Vartak Purskar for her book Narivadi Chintan Peripekh Te Vihar by Delhi Govt. We wish her good luck in all her future endeavors.

Dr. Rajiv Midha, Associate Professor, retired from the college on 31 January, 2025 after serving for 43 years. He did his M.Com., M.Phil., Ph.D. from Department of Commerce, Delhi School of Economics and M.Sc. (Computer Science), and MCA from MD University. COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE

Bhai Gurdas Library

The Bhai Gurdas Library serves as a key academic resource of the College, housing an extensive collection of books, journals, and magazines. In a move towards modernization, the library has transitioned from manual log books to a digital footfall recording system using Koha Software. This advancement has significantly improved data organization and student activity tracking. Additionally, the installation of Koha Software has facilitated efficient library operations, including cataloging, circulation, and OPAC services. Both faculty and students now have online access to the library. The library is also a registered member of INFLIBNET and DELNET, further enhancing its resource network.

Computer Labs

The College houses seven fully functional computer laboratories, all equipped with internet connectivity. Both students and faculty members are provided free access to Wi-Fi services. The infrastructure includes 180 computers, supported by two servers and six printers, available for academic use. Regular upkeep and upgrades are carried out under the competent supervision of Mr. Sunny Kumar.

Student Counselor

Ms. Shenna Dhingra Sabharwal, a qualified and experienced counselor is available in the college on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 11am - 1pm. The main goal of the counselor is to play a pivotal role in nurturing the mental, emotional, and academic well-being of students. One-on-one counseling is provided to students across all courses and semesters. The concerns are varied ranging from academic and examination stress to personal challenges like anxiety and depression, relationship issues, body image and self-esteem struggles. Every session is focused on creating a safe, non-judgmental space to foster insight, growth, and resilience. Multiple group sessions aimed at helping students are conducted to explore various career options, set academic goals, and manage study-related stress needs.

College Canteen

The college canteen serves not only as a space for meals but also as a hub for social engagement and relationship-building, contributing to the campus's dynamic environment. It provides a welcoming setting where students from varied backgrounds interact informally and form bonds over food and conversation. While the main canteen is currently under renovation, a temporary facility remains functional from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM, offering a variety of snacks and beverages

at reasonable prices.

College Gym

The College features an in-house gym facility, open to both students and faculty through a membership system. Studies indicate a strong link between regular physical activity, fitness levels, and improved academic outcomes. The gym promotes holistic well-being by fostering awareness of the importance of physical and mental health. It is equipped with modern fitness machines and tools, and operates from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM, subject to specific terms and conditions.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has maintained its commitment to educational excellence through consistent promotion of improved practices within the institution. Despite a transition in leadership, various initiatives started within the last few years by IQAC have been continued to ensure scholarly distinction, professional growth, and collaborative educational experiences.

A considerable portion of IQAC's resources this year was dedicated to supporting the professional advancement of academic staff. The promotion of one colleague to Professor (Level 14) one to Associate Professor (Level 13) and 13 to Senior Assistant Professor roles (Level 11) was facilitated. Fair evaluation mechanisms were developed under Dr. Priyanka Srivastava's guidance. 5 more newly appointed educators with diverse pedagogical backgrounds have been added this year to the 48 appointments made last year.

With the successful implementation of a comprehensive Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system last year, the work was cut out to optimize its reach to make work easier for the academic staff. This year, this centralized platform for the management of attendance records, internal evaluations, and continuous assessment helped significantly reduce the administrative responsibilities previously shouldered by the Faculty. The institution saw the teachers managing data more efficiently, and their paper dependency was minimized as manual attendance registers were rendered obsolete. The institutional learning environment has been positively impacted by the workflow efficiencies created through this system. An integral component of the feedback mechanism involves the distribution of feedback forms, which allow students to express their grievances and contribute to the improvement of the institution.

An internship program was established by IQAC through which students were provided with practical ERP systems experience. Educational institution operational insights were gained by participants, from whom positive evaluations were received. Feedback mechanisms were instituted whereby student grievances could be expressed and institutional improvement

suggestions could be submitted.

Various co-curricular and extracurricular events were supported by IQAC, including academic seminars, expert lectures, panel discussions, workshops, social campaigns, competitive activities, and cultural festivals. These initiatives were implemented with the objective of fostering comprehensive student development beyond traditional academic parameters, thereby cultivating confident, well-rounded individuals equipped with essential life competencies.

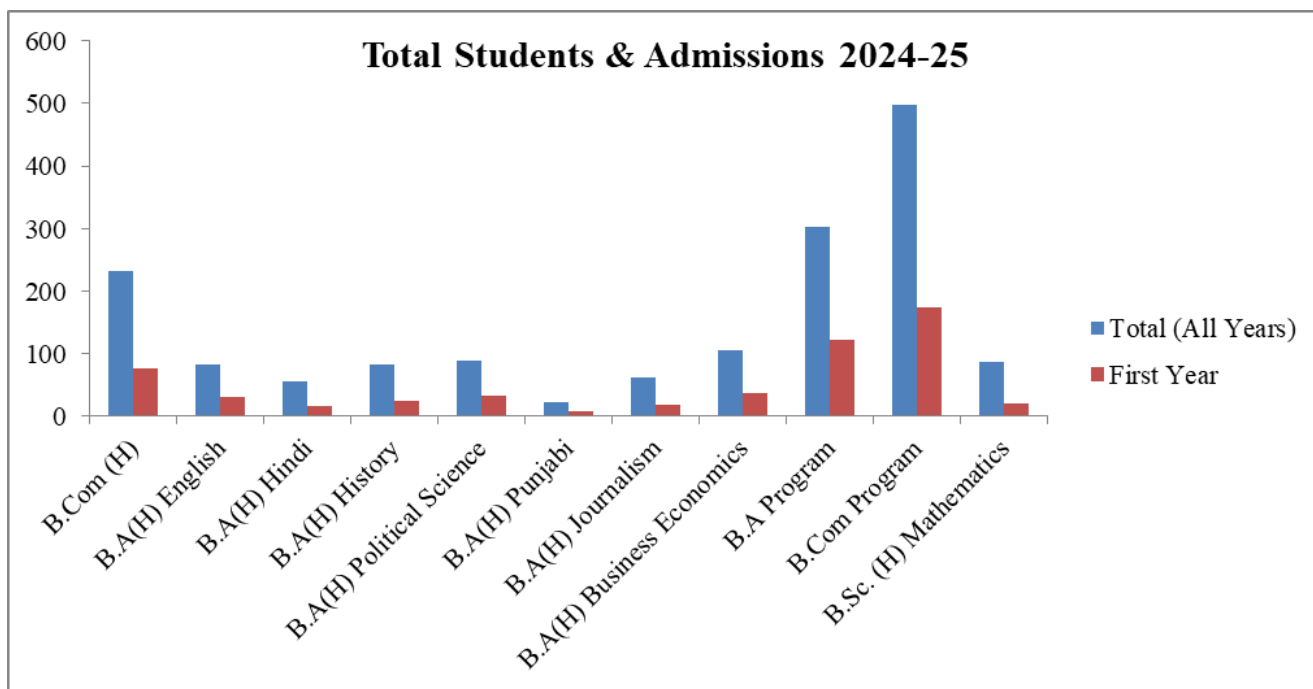
